Location

The Titanic was built at the Harland and Wolff shipyard on Queen's Island, Belfast, Ireland. After leaving Southampton on the 10th of April 1912 Titanic stopped at Cherbourg in France and Queenstown [now Cobh] in Ireland before Heading to New York .On the 14th of April Titanic received six warnings in south of Newfoundland, Canada. On the 15th of April Titanic sank in the North Atlantic Ocean 400 miles east of Newfoundland. The Titanic Was supposed to go to New York City USA

Millviana Dean

Millviana Dean was born in Branscombe, England on Febuary 2, 1912. Her full name was Elizabeth Gladys Dean. She was only nine weeks old when she rode the RMS Titanic with her parents Bertram Frank Dean, Georgette Eva Light and her brother Bertram Vere Dean. She was a third class passenger and also the youngest passenger on board she was also the youngest survivor. Her father died on the Titanic and her mother died on the 16th of September 1975 aged 96. In later years she participated in Titanic-related events. She never got married. Her brother died on April 14th 1992. She died May 31st 2009 in Ashurst United Kingdom. Millviana Dean was the last Passenger that was on the Titanic to die



Fascinating Facts

- The Titanic was built between 1909 and 1911
- It was 269 metres long and 53 metres tall
- The Titanic had a crew of around 900 people
- There was 825 tons of coal used per day
- There were over 2200 people on the titanic
- There was twelve dogs on the Titanic 3 of them survived
- About 25% of third class passengers survived
- The Titanic is about 12500 feet down
- Over 1500 people died because of the sinking
- 50 children died on the Titanic
- 43% of 2nd class passengers survived
- Only about 40 who where thrown or jumped into the sea were rescued
- The Titanic sunk on April 14th to the 15th of April 1912
