



7. Safety Mistakes

- The crew did not head warnings
- The boat was going too fast to stop or turn
- The safety flare sent out was not responded to by enough boats in the area, if more came more passengers could have been saved.
- The titanic did not have enough lifeboats for all the passengers and crew on board. With the lifeboats loaded to full capacity there were available seats for only one-third of those on board

8. How Many Lost Their Lives when the Titanic Sank

- The official total of all passengers and crew is
 2,229
 - 68 % of people on Board died when the Titanic sank, a total of 1517 people
 - 39% of total number of first class passengers on board died
 - 58% of the total number of second class passengers on board died
 - 76% of the total number of third class passengers on board died
 - This shows 1st class was the best place to be and got more spots on the lifeboats.

9. How Many Survived?

- The number of survivors varies from 701-713
 - → 61% the percentage of First Class passengers on
 → board who survived.
 - 42%survived the percentage of 2nd Class passengers who survived.
 - 24% the percentage of Third Class passengers on board who survived.
 - 2 the number of dogs believed to have survived
 - 20% the percentage of male passengers who survived.
 - 75% the percentage of female passengers who survived.

10. Lessons learnt from the Sinking of the Titanic

- The Titanic only was supplied with enough life boats and life jackets for half of its maximum number of passengers.
- The 20 lifeboats were not used to full capacity.
 - The ship was short on safety equipment. Some of the officers on the bridge did not have binoculars or search lights.
